






Challenging Questions

Carefully crafted questions elicit critical and creative thinking, spark curiosity, and increase engagement. Students need the challenge of questions that don't have easy or immediately available answers if they are to learn deeply. These questions require students not only to master applicable content. from the Standards, but to analyze, apply, and make sense of that content from their own perspectives. Over time, students can learn to generate their own meaty auestions as they design investigations, analyze evidence, or pursue solutions to real-world problems.




